

YOUTH -

After what seemed like a very quick summer, I am excited to get started with our regularly scheduled youth ministries. The summer has been filled with opportunities to minister more closely with some of our students because I was able to spend more time with them during summer vacation. At the same time, there are several of our students and their families who I have not had the chance to spend any time with this summer. It is these students I look foreword to having the chance to minister to now that summer vacation is over. Much of what I have planned for this school year is similar to what we have been doing for the past few years with a few exceptions.

The ministries that will remain the same will be our junior high outreach on Monday nights and our senior high Bible study. The junior high outreach encourages our junior high students to invite their unsaved friends to a fun night of games in which they will hear the gospel taught in a way that encourages them to make a decision to follow Jesus. Our lessons this year will follow the story of the Bible from beginning to end in an attempt to give the students a general overview of how God has revealed himself in the Bible. This ministry also involves several of our senior high students and several adult volunteers providing them the opportunity develop their service and leadership skills. I hope many of our high school students take advantage of this time to talk and pray about how their faith can affect their life and encourage each other as their friendships develop with one another.
